



SIGINT 2013 - Call for Papers

SIGINT - while also referring to the eavesdropping of signals (signal intelligence) - is understood by Unix Geeks as an abbreviation of "signal interrupt", which causes processes to abort; you might want to look for SIGINT in `/usr/include/asm/signal.h` in your own Linux source. The conference searches to define itself between these two meanings. Therefore SIGINT is about finding the relevant signals in a stream of information, their relevance in their specific context, and what marks this information as valuable and different from chaotic noise.



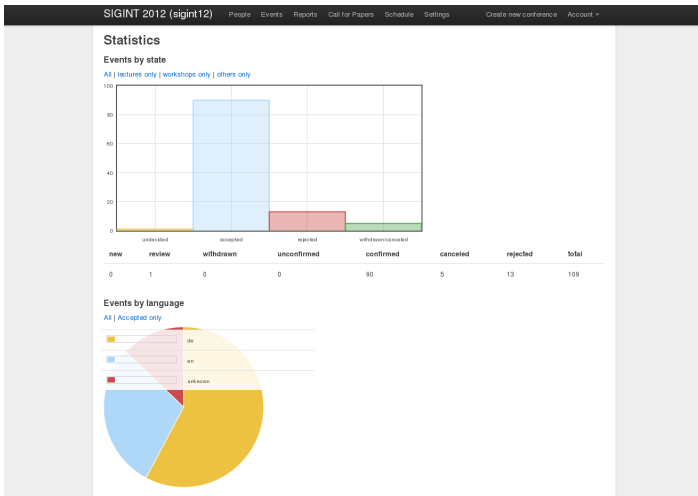
